We have set ourselves a few challenges for the year ahead.

On the 16th January we welcome the Guide Dog Association to our Monday assembly. They will help us launch a major fundraising challenge for the next twenty months, and that is to fund the purchase and training of a guide dog puppy. We'll need to raise at least £2500 and hopefully much more. You would be very welcome to join us for the assembly. With a 6 month old pup in training and a fully trained dog and her owner there too to talk to us, it promises to be a memorable occasion. I would be delighted if you would be able to join us too.

We'd like each form to organise one activity within the coming year. I hope the PTFA might do one event and we'll have a quiz night too.

We have also set ourselves the challenge of walking the Three Peaks in 24 hrs. Starting at Fort William in early May we will set off up Ben Nevis at 5pm, descend in the dark and head straight to Scafell Pike in the Lake District. We'll begin this four hour walk in the early hours of the morning, descend in the light and speed off to North Wales to

climb Snowdon. If all goes to plan, twelve hours of driving and twelve hours of walking will see us achieve our goal within the day.

Over the holidays we did the first two training walks, each five hours long and 18km in distance, taking us over the coastal path. We did fairly well though we all agreed that there is lots more training to complete to get closer to our ambition. I'll keep you informed of our progress and hope you will be able to sponsor us.



Our second challenge is a very topical one and involves the amount of sugar we have hidden in our food. It has been a topic of concern that many of you have shared with me in some form or other.

As a result, we are going to start the ball rolling in three ways:

- There will be one day each week when pudding will be much healthier with a choice of either yoghurt or fruit salad
- Match teas will take on a healthier look
