

I will be visiting every Sunday to help acclimatise the owls to the outside world.

It would be wonderful if at some point we could organise something for the school as I would *love* for them to see what an amazing place it is.

The Extreme Falconry Centre is hoping to open to the public by the end of May and I highly recommend a visit!
