Mrs Wilson and I travelled to the London swimming arena on Saturday to support Tallulah T and Freya B in the IAPS national swimming finals.






And finally, please do put two very important dates in your diary.

Both swam extremely well in their heats. Tallulah swimming a time of 41.65 in the 50m breast stroke to finish 12th overall.

Freya qualified for the final in the 25m butterfly and was so unlucky to finish in 4th place in a time of 14.94 just outside the medals.


