Our two by two procession through town found us all in St Peter's Church at 9.30am for the Form 8 Leavers' Service. A quick break back at school and then we found ourselves in the hall for Speech Day and Prize Giving. The Mayor of Dorchester, Richard Biggs joined us alongside guest speaker Ben Vessey, Headmaster of Canford School.

Chair of Governors, Philip Fry, got the ceremony started with his recollections of being a parent and governor for the last ten years. He finished off his speech with his memory of a member of staff falling asleep in a lesson. I then invited Ben Vessey to hand out the prizes and to address the school. Ben spoke eloquently and seemed absolutely on message with our own hopes for young children. He extolled the virtues of how failure helps us become better people and how we should react to moments of success with modesty and thoughts for those who might not be in the same position. It was very inspiring.

We then escaped the furnace of the hall to enjoy Pimms and canapés on the lawn followed by the Leavers' lunch for the Form 8 families. As always, Kerry and her team served up a sumptuous banquet for us all and the year came to a very lovely end.

Can I take this opportunity to thank you for your great support over the course of this year and wish you a very happy summer with your families.
