We looked up into the tree to observe the changing colours of the leaves.




The children enjoyed making the pictures of our autumn tree pictures. We had such fun!

## ***News from the Lab***


Form 7 continued to find out more about cells by using an excellent app on the Ipads called Google expeditions.
